I am truly delighted to present you Gobi oyu development support fund operational report of 2017.

Oyu tolgoi LLC executed Cooperation Agreement with Umnugobi aimag, Khanbogd soum of Umnugobi aimag on 22 April, 2015 according to Minerals law of Mongolia and international standards followed by Rio Tinto to fulfill its vision 'Natural wealth to enduring value, knowledge, and skill'.

In order to implement the Cooperation Agreement, Gobi oyu development support fund was established and Oyu togloi LLC provides Gobi oyu development support fund 5 million US. Dollar per annum pursuant to Cooperation Agreement in order to finance projects and programs those contribute to the sustainable development of Umnugobi aimag and wellbeing and livelihood of the Umnugobi aimag community. Until the end of 2017, Gobi oyu development support fund financed 65 project and programs worth 26,7 billion tugrugs.

Social infrastructure, capital projects such as new kindergartens, health care center, school sports hall, school and kindergarten complex building, inter-soum animal health care center, soum boiler houses were constructed in Umnugobi aimag. Furthermore, you can familiarize with the sustainable development programs are implemented according to each Thematic Schedules of the Cooperation Agreement which are contributing to the wellbeing of the Umnugobi aimag community and to the local development.

For the future generation of Umnugobi aimag, 'Future generation fund' was established and started "Gobi oyu-student scholarship" program to support Umnugobi aimag youth education and opened up a special Savings account for the future generation of Umnugobi people.

To conclude, I am pleased for the fact Oyu tolgoi LLC successfully implemented Cooperation Agreement by cooperating with the local organizations and supportively investing in local community by strengthening community trust and cooperation and have accomplishments that we can take pride. I believe that we will have a strong cooperation.

Gobi oyu development support fund NGO was established on 25th of September, 2015 to ensure execution of Cooperation Agreement between Umnugobi aimag, Khanbogd soum and Oyu Tolqoi LLC.

Oyu Tolgoi LLC makes 5 million USD or equivalent MNT financial contribution to the Gobi Oyu DSF per annum in accordance with

the clause 8.3 of the Cooperation Agreement. Gobi Oyu DSF aims to contribute to the sustainable development of Umnugobi aimag and Partner soums by financing and managing appropriate and effective projects and programs that target health, education, training, employment, local business expansion, environment and preservation of cultural heritage.



GOBI OYU DEVELOPMENT SUPPORT FUND GOVERNANCE AND ORGANIZATION

The highest governing body of the DSF is the Fund Board that consists of seven members from Umnugobi aimag, Khanbogd soum and Oyu Tolgoi LLC.

An appointed Independent Custodial Trustee executes its responsibility of the Auditing Committee and daily operations are managed by DSF staff with four members led by the Executive Director.

In addition to the establishment of a structure in accordance with the law, parties formed the Relationship Committee in

charge of supporting and overseeing mutual understanding and cooperation. The Relationship Committee consists of 13 members; 4 representatives from Oyu Tolgoi LLC and 9 representatives from Community members. Oyu Tolgoi LLC is represented by the appointees of the departments of procurement, human resource and training, environment and community relations –all of which are in close relationship with the community. The Community members are represented by the appointees of soum government, management of aimag sector departments, agencies and civil society organizations.



GOBI OYU DEVELOPMENT SUPPORT FUND GOVERNANCE

The Fund Board and the Relationship Committee consist of Oyu Tolgoi LLC and local representatives for successful implementation of the Cooperation Agreement made between Oyu Tolqoi LLC, Umnuqobi aimag and Khanbogd soum. The Board and Relationship committee are involved in every phase of the Fund operations: receiving, reviewing and evaluating proposals submitted by local communities.

FUND BOARD OF DIRECTORS

DSF Board is the highest governing body of the Gobi Oyu Development Support Fund. The Board has 7 members: 3 members from the communities are appointed upon nomination jointly by Umnuqobi aimag and Khanboqd soum, 4 members from Oyu Tolgoi Board are appointed by Oyu Tolgoi LLC.

An Independent Custodial Trustee is appointed to improve governance, ensure compliance of the Cooperation Agreement, advice to the Fund Board and enforce fund rules in accordance with the Fund Charter.

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AREAS OF PROJECTS AND PROGRAMS ACCEPTED BY THE GOBI OYU DEVELOPMENT SUPPORT FUND PURSUANT TO THEMATIC SCHEDULE OF COOPERATION AGREEMENT

Cooperation agreement is an arrangement between Umnugobi aimag, Khanbogd soum and Oyu Tolgoi LLC and contains the following Thematic Schedules, **including:**

- Water management
- Environmental management
- Traditional animal husbandry, pastureland management
- National history culture and tourism
- Social basic services / health, education and training/
- Social infrastructure and capital investment

Fund receives proposals according to the outlined Thematic Schedules and provides non-repayable funding to the selected proposals that deliver benefit to the Umnugobi aimag community and target priority areas of Umnugobi aimag.

The Thematic Schedules also include "Local business development and procurement of goods and services". As this Schedule aims to support local businesses for profit, the cooperation has a different scope such as low interest loans to the partner communities that is supported by the Fund.




GOBI OYU DSF FUNDING AREAS AND CRITERIA KEY FUNDING AREAS

Parties have roles and responsibilities under the Cooperation Agreement and Oyu Tolgoi LLC agreed to contribute to the social and economic development of Umnugobi aimag in the areas of 7 Thematic Schedules that are social infrastructure, environment, water management, national history culture, traditional animal husbandry, social basic services and local business development and procurement of goods and services.

Gobi Oyu DSF receives proposals from the community (individuals and institutions) that are to be implemented in the Umnugobi aimag according to 6 thematic schedules - social infrastructure, environment, water management, national history and culture, traditional animal husbandry and social basic services. The proposals are then submitted to the Relationship Committee and Fund Board for the selection of projects and programs that are aligned with Aimag development priorities.

Fund executed an agreement with Khan bank of Umnugobi aimag to support local business development and procurement of goods and services. Khan bank provides loans up to 30 million MNT with 1% interest to Partner communities' start-up businesses and individuals who are willing to expand their businesses through submission of their proposals in a tender.



Local enterprise development & Goods service procurement

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




GOBI OYU-STUDENT SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

One of the major programs of Gobi Oyu DSF for the future generation of Umnugobi Aimag is the Gobi Oyu-Student Scholarship program. The program has been successfully running its second year in 2017.

- The Goviin Ukhaan NGO of Umnugobi aimag was selected as the Management Body of the Gobi Oyu-Student Scholarship Program.
- According to the submission of Umnugobi Aimag Governor's Office on the priority occupations, the Selection Committee was
 established involving representatives from Social Development Department of the Aimag Governor's Office, "Gobi Oyu DSF"
 and Goviin Ukhaan NGO. This Selection Committee selected scholarship recipients of the academic year of 2017.
- In 2017, within the scope of the Gobi Oyu-Student Scholarship program, 57 students who are admitted to the state and accredited schools in the Aimag prioty occupations area received a scholarship funding of 105,215,602 MNT.



Explanation:

Some of the project funding amount listed above are as approved by the Fund Board and some are the contract price agreed after tender bidding process. The reason is that the Gobi Oyu Development Support Fund provides funds upon approval of the Fund Board. If the contract amount of the project progmra with the selected bidder is less than the amount that is budgeted and approved by the Fund Board, the difference is allocated to the next projects and programs.

Khanbogd soum SCHOOL AND KINDERGARTEN complex building

640 children high school and 200 children kindergarten complex of Khanbogd soum





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PROJECT RATIONALE

Currently, 970 students study in the school with a capacity of 360 students and 420 children attend in the kindergarten with a capacity of 300 children. Also, 40 children are in one classroom, and 208 children are unable to be admitted in kindergarten.

Project objective

Create a comfortable learning environment for children by building school and kindergarten complex in Khanbogd Soum Center that is connected to the engineering infrastructure that meets modern standards.

PROJECT WORKS

The construction work of a complex of 640 – student school and 200-child kindergarten will be carried out. The complex will be fully integrated with art and sports hall, kitchen with cold and warm storage and gym, day care center, outdoor playground and soccer field. It will be fully connected to the engineering network, such as drinking water, sewage, heating and electricity.

PROJECT BENEFITS

This complex construction is not only one of the largest social infrastructure projects financed by the DSF in Khanbogd soum but also in the Umnuqobi Aimaq. After the completion of the project in the 3rd quarter of 2018:

- 840 children in the school and kindergarten in Khanbogd soum will be provided with comfortable learning and living conditions
- 75 teachers and staff will be employed in the school with a capacity of 640 students
- 30 teachers and staff will be employed in the kindergarten with a capacity of 200 children
- A total of 105 jobs will be created in the Soum
- Infrastructure, about 3,000 meters of tap water, sewage and heating will be created with this complex, so that other organizations, enterprises and households will be able to connect to this engineering line in the Soum Center.





INTERSOUM ANIMAL HEALTHCARE CENTER in Khanbogd soum

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PROJECT RATIONALE

In the recent years, the number of livestock in the country is increasing dramatically. According to the Umnugobi aimag statistics, the number of livestock increased by 1 million for the last 5 years and reached 2.6 million at the end of 2017. Due to this context, there are issues such as over grazing, increasing number of animal infectious diseases, poor livestock breeds that leads to less productivity which results in poor quality of livestock products.

Project objective

Developments in breeding and animal health in the region that will contribute to increasing potential production, market competitiveness, income and livelihoods of herders through the development of a benchmark with a combination of traditional techniques and advanced technologies in 4 eastern soums of Umnugobi aimag.

PROJECT WORKS

In Khanbogd soum center, animal health center building was built with a 4 - Car garage, 4 - Employee housing building, animal shelter, fence and other equipment and facilities such as 133 types of laboratory equipment and office furniture.

PROJECT BENEFITS

- 1554 herder households in Khanbogd, Bayan-Ovoo, Manlai and Tsogttsetsii soums, as well as the neighboring aimag herders will have an access to veterinary services
- Herders' knowledge and skills on livestock health and quality will be improved and livestock herding management will be improved as a whole.
- Veterinary services will be improved
- It will save costs to build an animal health center in each 4 soums
- Awareness on food security will be raised
- The center will provide veterinary, breeding and laboratory services for the improvement of animal health and quality in 4 eastern soums of Umnugobi aimag
- 4-5 jobs will be created in Khanbogd soum

PROJECT RATIONALE

Larger buildings and facilities are being built in Manlai soum center, thus the capacity of the old heating plant is becoming insufficient. In addition, the old heating plant is located in the "A" zone of the soum center which is 17 m far from the kindergarten, 28 m far from the dormitory, 33 m far from the school building, and in the middle of over 100 households housing plot. Thus, school and kindergarten children and residents are exposed to the air pollution such as of coal, ash and steam bolier smoke. Based on the soum development plan and heating demand of the customers, new heating plant will be built at a reasonable distance from the soum center that meets human needs, health and safety standards which will result in the improvement of healthy living and learning environment of school and kindergarten children and residents living in the zone. In addition, with the increase of a capacity of the heating plant, the number of households connected to the central heating system will increase.

Buildings in this soum have independent heating systems. This creates issues such as air pollution and high utility costs since some have electric heating system.

Due to this population growth and concentration, the settlement area is expanding from day to day and there is an urgent need to improve urban public transportation service.

Project objective

Provide residents and children living in the remote area of ger districts an inexpensive transport service and provide people with disabilities and senior citizens for free of charge service by the development of low-cost eco-friendly buses in the 5 routes as part of Dalanzadgad soum public transport network.

Overall, the project implementation will reduce air pollution in the aimag center.

Over 950 children study in the 12-year high school of Khanbogd soum, Umnugobi aimag. Restrooms for students and teachers were not built in the school building in the first place. It is one of the priorities for the school to build school public toilets.

Due to lack of proper school public toilet facility, students, during their recession, have to stand in a long line waiting outside the school for outside toilet, are forced to use open areas of the school and/or have to prolong their biological process with uncomfortable feeling. In addition, there is no place to wash hands as basic hygiene standard. The consequence could be spread of infectious diseases. It is necessary to minimize these negative conditions and create a pleasant environment for the teachers and students.

Project objective

Upon implementation of the project, school teachers and students of Khanbogd Soum will be provided with a public toilet and they will be able to function in a healthy, safe and comfortable working and learning environment. After the implementation of the project, incidences of infectious diseases due to poor sanitation facilities will be reduced, and it will ensure the rights of teachers and students to study and work in a clean and safe environment.



The issue was addressed in the Aimag governor's action plan 2016-2020 Together-We, and the Development General Plan of Dalanzadgad soum - 2030 and policy document on the blood prevention of residents. In the past few years, central roads in Dalanzadgad soum have been built without any flood drainage system, so when it rains, roads are directly flooded and there is a great risk to life, health and property of individuals and organizations.

Project objective

By establishing a flood drainage system for roads and other facilities, residents of 2, 3, 4, 6, 7 baghs of Dalanzadgad soum will be protected from the flood that comes in the spring due to melted mountain snow and summer flood to ensure their safe and healthy living environment. Also, residents' real estates, streets, traffic roads and pedestrian roads, children's playgrounds and concrete fields that are created by large amount of investments will be protected.

PROJECT WORKS

The project will build 6.5 km long road surface water drainage line in central roads of Dalanzadgad soum.

- Protect residents of the baghs 2, 3, 4, 6, 7 of Dalanzadgad soum from sping and summer flood.
- Ensure safe and healthy living environment for citizens in soum center.

It is important to protect the environment of the region,

reduce sand movement and desertification and create a favorable environment for tourism. The initiators of the project have made their effort to build fence, plant trees and make water reservoirs with their own funds since 2013. However, as they do not generate any income, not all the problems are solved to plant trees. Now they need an irrigation system.

Project objective

Plant a model Gobi Grove in the soum in order to contribute to the protection of the environment, reduction of the sand movement and desertification, and to create favorable environment for tourism.



In 2015, 149 cases of sexually transmitted infections were recorded in Umnogobi aimag and the number increased to 163 in 2016. Out of which 32.5% was girls under the age of 19. Therefore, their knowldege on sexual and reproductive rights and STID needs to be improved.

Project objective

Strengthen and stabilize the activities of the health clubs with the participation of teenagers and youth. Train the peer trainers and educate them on the knowledge and skills of sexual and reproductive rights and STID.



PROJECT WORKS

- Six peer training sessions for peer trainers were organized and 300 teachers and counselors from 12 schools were trained (14 advocacy work and 1 summer camp training)
- A total of 35 social workers, biology teachers and school doctors from 6 schools in Dalanzadgad, Polytechnic College, Gurvantes, Noyon, Nomgon, Bayan-Ovoo, Tsogttsetsii and Manlai soums have been trained to improve their participation and knowledge about sexual and reproductive right and STID.
- Three-in-one printer was purchased and handed over to the Department of Health and the Department of Education and Culture to support the further activities and initiatives aimed at improving adolescent health education.
- In the future, in order to expand, motivate and support initiatives and future cooperation for improving the health education of teenagers, printers with a capacity of three operations were added to 2 organizations, such as the Health Department and the Education and Culture Department.
- Healthy future, Our choice sign boards were installed in 13 schools.

- Teenagers aged 14-17 years from Khanbogd, Tsogttsetsii, Manlai, Bayan-Ovoo, Gurvantes, Noyon and Dalanzadgad soums will be trained on the knowledge about sexual, reproductive rights, STIDs, their prevention.
- A total of 250 peer trainers and social workers will be trained, out of which 25 will be from the soums including Khanbogd, Tsoqttsetsii, Manlai, Bayan-Ovoo, Gurvantes and Noyo and 80 students from 7 schools of Dalanzadgad soum.

educational program that was developed over 50 years ago by German Nobel Laureate Arthur Fischer. Program implementation has brought the quality of preschool education to the next level.

Project objective

Within the project implementation, 10 teachers's capacity will be improved and 313 children will be able to develop their skills in constructive speaking, thinking, imagination and creativity by using Fisher Tip brain development training program, manuals and tools. This will be the first internationally accepted brain development program for preschool children in Umnugobi aimag.

PROJECT WORKS

10 teachers of kindergarten No25, Dalanzadgad soum received training on the curriculum, toolkits, computing by Steam Brainy Tech LLC. They also gained a practical experience to implement the program successfully. Program toolkits were bought. 2017-2018 eightmonth training course for the children of kindergarten No25 has started. At the end of the project implementation, there will be a monitoring and evaluation activity to measure and analyze the results.

PROJECT WORKS

313 children of kindergarten No25 in Dalanzadgad soum will play with artistic games and toys, learn basic concepts of natural science, technology, engineering and mathematics, and develop their creative thinking, craft and teamwork skills in an integrated way.

1843 (43.8 %) were unemployed women and the reasons for unemployment because they are stay home childcare providers and/or unable to find right jobs etc.

Project objective

Following activities will be carried out in support of unemployed women who are seeking job.

50 women from all soums of Umnugobi aimag will be employed and other 50 women will be trained in skills training and will have an equipment support:

- Provision of financial support
- Technical training that would issue a certificate

PROJECT WORKS

160 teachers nominated by the Education, Culture and Art Department of Umnugobi aimag have been trained in 124 academic hours of skills training. 16 teachers from Dalanzadgad soum and 14 teachers from Tsogttsetsii soum and 10 teachers each from rest of 13 soums attended in the training and received a certificate.

Average exam score of high school graduates in Umnugobi aimag was less than the average of other aimag graduates in the last 8 years. For example, the average score for general admission test in all aimags was 502.6 in 2014, 498.5 in 2015 and 499.2 in 2016. In Umnugobi aimag, this score was 497.1, 486.7 and 499.8 respectively. Therefore, it is necessary to improve general admission test score of high school graduates of Umnugobi aimag.

Project objective

Additional practical sessions on ten subjects will be conducted to the students of high schools of Dalanzadgad soum, so they will be prepared for an admission in the colleges and universities based on their passion and talents.

PROJECT WORKS

Selected teachers from the Aimag Association of Senior Teachers were invited to the Dalanzadgad soum high schools. Then a survey among students in the 12th grade was conducted. 797 students (double counted) were enrolled in preparation course for general admission tests on a voluntary basis. In addition, 1400 students of 9th to 12th grade attended in the lectures such as Life Choice leading to a Success and Dream Management, 1500 students received a Career Guidance Counseling Service.

PROJECT WORKS

1400 students were enrolled in lectures and trainings, 1500 received a Career Guidance Counseling Service,797 students (double counted) were enrolled in the preparation course for general admission tests. Every child acquired the skills they needed for the admission of their interested schools in their preferred areas.

cases of sexually transmitted disease were registered, out of which 162 (88%) were aged 15-35 years old. Mongolian Law on Youth Development Support was passed by the State Great IKh Khural in May 2017 to protect youth rights and support their development. It provides a legal framework to resolve the above mentioned issues.

Umnugobi aimag has a total of 63,661 populations and 11.3 % (7193) of them are senior citizens. As of 2016, 2394 senior citizens were living in 14 rural soums and 4799 senior citizens were living in Dalanzadgad soum, central soum. Out of them, 2301 (31.9%) were under medical regular and intensive

control due to sickness. Main sickness among senior citizens come from cardiovascular disease - 26.6%, gastrointestinal disorders - 11.2%, ear disorders 10.6%, cancer - 6%, bones and joint disorders 10.3% respectively.

Project objective

Conduct medical checks and intensive monitoring to the patients with
4th grade medical condition people with chronic disease and half decompensation and patients with
5th grade medical condition people with chronic disease full decompensation.

PROJECT WORKS

6000 copies of four different types of promotional materials were published and distributed. A survey conducted among 3000 senior citizens using questionnaire (women 55 and over years of age, men 60 and over years of age) and the database of the survey was created. A total of 8502 senior citizens, out of which 6454 from all 14 soums of Umnugobi aimag and 2048 from Dalanzadgad soum had a medical examination. 650 senior citizens who have 4th and 5th grade of chronic diseases went under intensive monitoring at the Umnugobi Aimag Health Center, inter-soum hospital and other health centers.

PROJECT WORKS

A total of 8502 elderly citizens over 55 years of age from 15 soums of the aimag had a health examination and tested for early detection of diseases to prevent from further complications, if any, and decrease the number of early deaths (blindness, stroke, heart attack, cancer, and dementia). Senior citizens who have 4th and 5th grade medical conditions were enrolled in intensive medical monitoring. Inter soum collaborations were improved for senior citizens' health care and services. In all soums, a total of 67 bedridden seniors received complete health care and services in the comfort of their own home. It built the capacity of 75 doctors and specialists of 23 health institutions of Umnugobi aimag.



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

PROJECT RATIONALE

As a result of tremendous research and scientific work to increase the productivity of the livestock in Umnugobi aimag, Gobi Gurvan Saikhan Cashmere goat breed was recognized in 1971. And based on the 50 years of research, Galbiin Gobiin Ulaan and Khaniin Khestiin

Khuren camel breeds were recognized and registered officially. In 1992, livestock privatization took place. Pastoral science and research institute of Gobi region and Galbiin Gobiin Ulaan goat breeding farm was collapsed. Since then, breeding and selection activities were never conducted. Now, it is necessary to make a research on the productivity and selection of breeds.

Project objective

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Carry out selection and breeding work of brand breeds of Umnugobi aimag - Gobi Gurvan Saikhan goat breed, Khanii Khestiin Khuren and Galbiin Gobi Ulaan camel breeds and develop a strategic plan for breeding for approval and establish a breeding pool.

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
PROJECT WORKS

15503 livestock of 118 herder households who herd the main herd of Govi gurvan saikhan goat breed in Bulgan and Sevrei soums and 180 livestock of breeding pool, as a total of 15683 head livestock of all ages were sorted for spring classification, and registered with ear tags and recorded in a journal. A total of 99 female and male goats were combed for yield. Cashmere samples taken from 125 goats of Bulgan and Sevrei soums were tested. In Khanbogd soum 458 female and male camels of 15 herder households were weighed, ear tagged and recorded in a journal. In Mandal-Ovoo soum, 465 camels of 10 households were weighed, ear tagged and recorded in a breeding journal and based on the spring testing and measurement, 4 male goats, 133 hams and 337 female goats that were purchased and handed over to contract herders.

PROJECT WORKS

The protection work of breeds Gobi Gurvan Saikhan, Khaniin Khetsiin Khuren and Galbiin Gobiin Ulaan of Umnugobi aimag were carried out and 17,753 livestock were classified, weighed, combed and ear tagged in Bulgan, Sevrei, Khanbogd and Mandal-Ovoo soums. A total of 474 livestock of 154 herder households were bought from them and created a breeding herd.

PROJECT RATIONALE

Pasture land occupies 11072.3 thousand hectares (67 %) of total provincial land, decreased by 285.5 thousand hectares comparing last year, and 1069,6 thousand ha pasture land of 7 soums have been degraded due to mining operations and their traffic resulting in the

harvest decline to 0.2 center/ha. 27.9% of total pastureland (3064.7 thousand ha) was assessed as degraded by 2010 pasture monitoring work as of the latest.

Project objective

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Organize herder households of Khanbogd, Bayan-Ovoo, Bayandalai and Tsogt-Ovoo soums into a group and conduct assessment of pastureland condition and capacity. Improve the monitoring framework of implementation of pastureland management plan.

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PROJECT WORKS

A total of 26 herder groups have been established and approved their rules or norms—4 groups in each Khanbogd, Bayandalai, and Tsogt-Ovoo soums and 14 groups in Bayan-Ovoo soum. In the target soums, at least 1-3 times of training sessions were organized and 377 herders were informed about their pasture capacity and total of 10 ha land was fenced. Also, in those soums, a research team is working at 71 points to do pastureland monitoring, necessary equipment were provided.

PROJECT WORKS

The program will enable herders in Khanbogd, Bayan-Ovoo, Bayandalai and Tsogt-Ovoo soums to gain information about pastureland capacity, resources and appropriate use. Herder households were organized into groups that support each other and use pastureland efficiently and they will have an integrated land map that shows pasture capacity and resources.

Protect the state and aimag protected immovable historical and cultural sites in Bayandalai, Bulgan, Bayan-Ovoo, Gurvantes, Mandal-Ovoo, Manlai, Noyon, Nomgon, Khanbogd, Sevrei soums and handed over to individuals in charge of guarding under an agreement.

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PROJECT WORKS

Guidelines on Preservation and Protection of Immovable Historic and Cultural Heritage that are with two chapters and seven sub chapters were developed and published. Training workshop on the Preservation and Protection of Immovable Historic and Cultural Heritages of Umnugobi Aimag and Way Forward was organized and a total of 160 participants attended in this first consultative workshop including 107 contracted individuals, citizens, soum governors and an officer in charge of cultural heritages.

PROJECT WORKS

Information session on the law on protection of cultural heritage, legal framework, archeology, paleontology and immovable historical and cultural heritage protection was conducted to a total of 179 people including 107 contracted guard citizens in 14 soums of Umnugobi aimag, 39 bag governors and 18 cultural center staff.

Create a tradition classroom and furbish it with traditional materials and tools for the lessons of the traditional culture in Khanboqd primary school.

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PROJECT WORKS

A tradition classroon was created and 466 training equipment and tools, books and toys were provided to the room. Primary school children and their teachers planted 650 elm trees in their school yard. Currently, 25-30 children attend in a traditional culture training in one class.

PROJECT WORKS

Throughout the implementation of the program, more than 950 primary school children were enrolled in the traditional culture trainings to develop their knowledge and skills playing traditional games. PROJECT RATIONALE

As of 2016, in Umnugobi aimag, there are over 1000 vegetable growers of 800 households and they plant vegetables, berries and fodder in about 200 ha of land and provide just about 35% of vegetables and 0.1% of berry products for the population. Therefore, it is necessary to

formulate and implement a policy to support the integrated greenhouse farm development in Umnugobi aimag and make a research on appropriate Gobi irrigation systems to identify the development opportunities.

Project objective

Develop farming technologies that are suitable for climate and soil condition of Umnugobi aimag. Disseminate that knowledge on new technologies through trainings for household level vegetable growers and businesses for their capacity building. Develop a vegetable and berry farming in the main agricultural areas such as Dalanzadgad, Bulgan, Sevrei and Noyon soums of Umnugovi Aimag.

PROJECT WORKS

The topographic mapping was undertaken in the location that greenhouse complex will be built and soil quality and its physical, chemical properties were analyzed in a laboratory. Upon creating a database based on the results of the test, most suitable irrigation system testing and configuration work was conducted. Five synthetic greenhouses with irrigation system were instaleed and experiemental seed farming started in 1 ha pilot plot. Tomatoes, cucumbers, strawberries, watermelons and pumpkins were planted in 1500 meter pilot plot. In addition, a specialist of Umnugobi aimag Food and Agriculture Department and agricultural experts of the Umnugobi aimag governor's office had experience sharing study tours to Gyeong Sang Buk province of Republic of Korea's Food Science and Technology Institute.

PROJECT WORKS

In Umnugobi aimag, 3 times of information sessions were organized to 200 agronomists and vegetable growers with double counting. First steps of greenhouse farming development will be taken in Dalanzadgad soum and topographic mapping network and soil tests will be made

A traditional medicine practitioner examined me. I received needles and suction cup therapy and the results have been very good. I would be very happy if this kind of program is conducted on a regular basis to the senior citizens.
